SCH CD-BULLYING-DEEPPFAKE

Effective: Aug 01, 2025 | Last Action (May 15, 2024): Referred to Rules Committee

Summary

This bill expands the definition of cyber-bullying to include AI-generated digital replicas and sexually explicit digitized depictions, effective in the 2025-2026 school year.

Business Impact

If you operate a platform that allows user-generated content in Illinois, you must ensure compliance with new bullying definitions by 2025 or face penalties.

Key Provisions

- Expands the definition of cyber-bullying to include AI-generated digital replicas and sexually explicit digitized depictions.
- Defines key terms related to artificial intelligence and digital replicas.
- Implementation begins with the 2025-2026 school year.
