Summary

Hospitals must ensure diagnostic algorithms are certified by both the Department of Public Health and the Department of Innovation and Technology, offering patients the option to decline their use.

Business Impact

If you operate a hospital in Illinois, you must ensure diagnostic algorithms are certified and obtain patient consent before use.

Key Provisions

- Hospitals must confirm diagnostic algorithms are certified by both the Department of Public Health and the Department of Innovation and Technology.
- Algorithms must have been shown to achieve equal or greater accuracy compared to traditional diagnostic methods.
- Patients must be informed of the use of diagnostic algorithms.
- Patients must be given the option to decline the use of diagnostic algorithms.
- The bill amends the Medical Patient Rights Act to enhance patient autonomy.
