Enact the Ohio Right to Compute Act

Summary

HB392 enacts section 9.89 to limit regulation of certain computational systems, including AI, and requires risk management for AI-controlled critical infrastructure.

Business Impact

If you manage AI in critical infrastructure, you must implement risk management policies.

Key Provisions

- Limits further regulation of certain computational systems, including AI (Section 9.89)
- Requires risk management policies for AI-controlled critical infrastructure
- Names the act the Ohio Right to Compute Act
