Summary

Hospitals must confirm diagnostic algorithms are certified by both the Department of Public Health and the Department of Innovation and Technology, and provide patients the option to consent before use. The algorithm cannot be the only diagnostic method available. The bill also amends the Medical Patient Rights Act to ensure patients are informed and can consent to the use of diagnostic algorithms.

Business Impact

If you operate a hospital in Illinois, you must ensure diagnostic algorithms are certified and obtain patient consent before use.

Key Provisions

- Hospitals must confirm diagnostic algorithms are certified by both the Department of Public Health and the Department of Innovation and Technology.
- Algorithms must demonstrate equal or greater accuracy than other diagnostic methods.
- Patients must be informed when a diagnostic algorithm is used.
- Patients must be given the option to consent to the use of a diagnostic algorithm.
- The algorithm cannot be the only diagnostic method available.
- The bill amends the Medical Patient Rights Act to ensure patient consent for algorithm use.
