Summary

SB180 restricts facial recognition technology and biometric identifiers, creating legal actions and prohibiting their use as evidence.

Business Impact

If you use facial recognition technology in Kentucky, you must cease its use and ensure compliance with new legal standards or face legal action.

Key Provisions

- Creates restrictions on the use of facial recognition technology and biometric identifiers.
- Establishes a cause of action for unauthorized use of biometric identifiers.
- Prohibits the use of facial recognition technology as evidence in legal proceedings.
- Proposes amendments to the Kentucky Rules of Evidence to exclude facial recognition evidence.
- Applies to various sectors utilizing facial recognition technology.
- Aims to enhance privacy protections for individuals.

Compliance Checklist

- Cease use of facial recognition technology and biometric identifiers | Who: All businesses and entities utilizing these technologies | Penalty: Legal action for unauthorized use
- Review and update evidence handling procedures to exclude facial recognition data | Who: Legal and compliance teams in affected organizations | Penalty: Inadmissibility of evidence in court
