AN ACT relating to biometric data.

Introduced

Risk: High

Comprehensive

Last Action (Mar 16, 2023): recommitted to Appropriations & Revenue (H)

Summary

The bill mandates private entities to create policies for biometric data collection, retention, and disclosure, establishing privacy protections.

Business Impact

If you collect biometric data in Kentucky, you must develop a written policy and retention schedule or face legal action.

Key Provisions

- Defines biometric identifiers and related terms.
- Requires private entities to create written policies for biometric data collection.
- Establishes a retention schedule for collected biometric identifiers.
- Imposes restrictions on the collection and trade of biometric data.
- Mandates disclosure of biometric information upon individual request.
- Creates a civil cause of action for violations of the Act.

Compliance Checklist

- Develop a written policy for biometric data collection. | Who: Private entities collecting biometric data. | Penalty: Civil action for non-compliance.
- Establish a retention schedule for biometric identifiers. | Who: Private entities collecting biometric data. | Penalty: Civil action for non-compliance.
