AN ACT relating to violations of privacy.

Introduced

Risk: High

Comprehensive

Last Action (Feb 23, 2023): to Judiciary (S)

Summary

The bill creates separate causes of action for the use of identification devices and facial recognition technology, and proposes new sections in multiple KRS chapters to make such evidence inadmissible.

Business Impact

If you use facial recognition technology in Kentucky, you must ensure compliance with new restrictions or face legal action.

Key Provisions

- Creates a cause of action for the introduction of identification devices.
- Creates a separate cause of action for the use of facial recognition technology and biometric identifiers.
- Proposes new sections in KRS Chapters 6, 13B, 23A, 24A, and 29A to make facial recognition technology inadmissible in court.

Compliance Checklist

- Ensure compliance with restrictions on facial recognition technology usage. | Who: Businesses and organizations using facial recognition technology. | Penalty: Potential legal action for non-compliance.
- Establish protocols for handling biometric identifiers. | Who: Organizations that collect or use biometric data. | Penalty: Legal recourse for affected individuals.
