AN ACT relating to violations of privacy.

Introduced

Comprehensive

Last Action (Apr 14, 2022): floor amendment (1) filed

Summary

This bill amends KRS sections to address privacy violations related to identification devices and restricts the use of facial recognition technology.

Business Impact

If you use facial recognition technology in Kentucky, you must ensure compliance with new restrictions or face legal action.

Key Provisions

- Amends KRS sections to create a cause of action for unauthorized introduction of identification devices.
- Restricts the use of facial recognition technology.
- Prohibits the use of facial recognition technology as evidence in court.
- Establishes a new rule of evidence making such evidence inadmissible.
- Removes the subsection allowing a petition to remove a minor or an incompetent person from parental control based on identification device decisions.

Compliance Checklist

- Ensure compliance with restrictions on facial recognition technology use. | Who: Businesses using facial recognition technology. | Penalty: Potential civil actions for non-compliance.
- Review and adjust evidence handling procedures to exclude facial recognition technology. | Who: Legal teams and compliance officers. | Penalty: Inadmissibility of evidence in court.
