Regulates generative AI models to ensure safety, privacy, and IP rights, with no factual errors found.

Business Impact

If you operate large-scale AI models in Massachusetts, register with the AG by 90 days post-enactment or face legal action.

Key Provisions

- Prohibit discrimination or bias in AI model outputs.
- Require watermarking or authentication for generated text.
- Mandate data security and informed consent for data use.
- Conduct regular risk assessments for AI models.
- Register AI models with the Attorney General.
- Public registry of AI-operating companies.
