Summary

This bill prohibits government entities in Minnesota from acquiring and using facial recognition technology.

Business Impact

If you operate a government entity in Minnesota, you must cease any use of facial recognition technology immediately to avoid legal repercussions.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits government entities from acquiring facial recognition technology.
- Prohibits government entities from using facial recognition technology.
