Facial recognition technology acquisition and use by government entities prohibited.

Summary

This bill prohibits government entities in Minnesota from acquiring and using facial recognition technology.

Business Impact

If you operate a government entity in Minnesota, you must cease the use of facial recognition technology immediately to avoid legal repercussions.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits government entities from acquiring facial recognition technology.
- Prohibits government entities from using facial recognition technology.
- Applies to all levels of government within Minnesota.

Compliance Checklist

- Cease the acquisition of facial recognition technology | Who: All government entities in Minnesota | Penalty: Legal challenges or penalties may apply for non-compliance.
- Stop using existing facial recognition technology | Who: All government entities in Minnesota | Penalty: Legal challenges or penalties may apply for non-compliance.
