Requires Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development to conduct study and issue report on impact of artificial intelligence on growth of State's economy.

Summary

The bill mandates a study on the economic impact of artificial intelligence on New Jersey's workforce and economy, with a report due within a year, in consultation with the New Jersey Commission on Science, Innovation and Technology.

Business Impact

If you operate in New Jersey and employ highly-skilled professionals, you must prepare for potential changes in the labor market due to AI by 2025.

Key Provisions

- Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development, in consultation with the New Jersey Commission on Science, Innovation and Technology, to conduct a study on AI's economic impact.
- Report to be submitted within one year of the bill's effective date.
- Study to include predictions on labor market impacts and new professions emerging from AI.
