Summary

NJ bill A3757 mandates training for law enforcement on interacting with autonomous vehicles, effective immediately.

Business Impact

If you operate autonomous vehicles, ensure law enforcement is trained for interactions by December 31, 2020.

Key Provisions

- Attorney General to develop training for law enforcement on autonomous vehicles (Section 1a).
- Training course and curriculum must be reviewed at least every five years (Section 1a).
- All current officers must complete training by December 31, 2020 (Section 1b).
- New officers must complete training before permanent appointment (Section 1c).
- Police Training Commission to adopt regulations (Section 1d).
- Defines 'autonomous vehicle' (Section 1e).
- Act takes effect immediately (Section 2).

Compliance Checklist

- Develop or approve a training course for law enforcement on autonomous vehicles. | Who: Attorney General, in consultation with the Commissioner of Transportation
- Complete training on autonomous vehicles. | Who: All law enforcement officers
- Complete training before permanent appointment. | Who: New law enforcement officers
