Summary

The bill mandates the Attorney General to study law enforcement's use of facial recognition technology and report recommendations for a Statewide policy.

Business Impact

If you operate a law enforcement agency in New Jersey, you must prepare for potential policy changes regarding facial recognition technology by the report's release.

Key Provisions

- The Attorney General must study law enforcement's use of facial recognition technology.
- A report with findings and recommendations must be issued within six months.
- The report will assess technology feasibility and current usage in generating police reports.
- Recommendations for a Statewide policy governing facial recognition technology use will be included.
- Facial recognition technology is defined as a computer application using algorithms for identification.
