NY A10909 establishes a right for individuals to correct outdated narratives post-legal resolution, requiring institutions to provide correction mechanisms.

Business Impact

Key Provisions

- Institutions must provide mechanisms for narrative correction.
- Mechanisms for context and updates must be provided.

- Implement mechanisms for individuals to contest and correct narratives. | Who: Automated system providers
- Ensure human review when narrative harm is alleged. | Who: Automated decision-making entities
