Summary

SB2807 addresses motor vehicles, including automated ones, regulating their operation and creating a criminal offense for non-compliance.

Business Impact

If you operate automated vehicles in Texas, ensure compliance with new regulations by 9/1/25 to avoid penalties.

Key Provisions

- Regulates operation with safety and registration requirements
- Creates a criminal offense for non-compliance

Compliance Checklist

- Obtain authorization to operate automated vehicles for commercial purposes | Who: Individuals or entities operating automated vehicles | Penalty: Class B misdemeanor for violations
- Ensure automated vehicles meet operational and safety standards | Who: Vehicle manufacturers and operators | Penalty: Penalties for non-compliance as specified in the bill
