Summary

AI companies must conduct safety tests and report results to NJ's Office of Information Technology, analyzing cybersecurity threats and biases.

Business Impact

If you sell AI in NJ, you must conduct annual safety tests and report results or face regulatory scrutiny.

Key Provisions

- AI companies must conduct safety tests on their technologies.
- Reports of safety tests must be submitted to the Office of Information Technology.
- Safety tests must analyze cybersecurity threats and biases.
- The Office will establish minimum requirements for safety tests.
- Reports must include a list of tested technologies and third-party testers.
- The Office will review each report submitted by AI companies.
