Summary

Requires the NJ Attorney General to arrange independent testing of facial recognition systems for accuracy variations based on demographic factors.

Business Impact

If you use facial recognition systems, prepare for potential scrutiny of accuracy across demographic factors.

Key Provisions

- Section 1(a): Requires independent testing of facial recognition systems for accuracy variations.
- Section 1(b): Mandates a report to the Legislature within 30 days after testing completion.
- Section 1(c): Defines 'facial recognition system'.
- Section 2: Act takes effect immediately.
