## Key Provisions

- Establishes a pilot project for internet voting for military personnel overseas.
- Requires the creation of a secure internet-based voting system.
- Mandates consultation with election officials for project development.
- Requires public notice and information dissemination about the project.
- Calls for a report on the project's feasibility and recommendations.
