Summary

Bill A1210 mandates a public hearing before law enforcement agencies in New Jersey can use facial recognition technology.

Business Impact

If you use facial recognition in law enforcement, you must hold a public hearing immediately.

Key Provisions

- Section 1(a): Requires public hearing before use of facial recognition technology.
- Section 1(b): Requires hearing within 60 days for current users.
- Section 1(c): Mandates identification of objectives and a follow-up hearing in five years.
- Section 1(d): Defines 'facial recognition technology'.
- Section 2: Act takes effect immediately.
