## Summary

This bill prohibits the use of facial recognition technology with officer cameras by local and state police, including the storage of biometric data.

## Business Impact

If you operate a police department in New York, you must stop using facial recognition with officer cameras immediately to avoid legal issues.

## Key Provisions

- Prohibits facial recognition technology use with officer cameras.
- Bans storage of biometric data collected via officer cameras.
- Applies to both local and state police departments.

## Compliance Checklist
