## Summary

The bill creates a temporary commission to study and investigate the regulation of artificial intelligence, robotics, and automation in New York.

## Business Impact

If you operate in AI or automation in New York, you must prepare for potential regulatory changes by December 31, 2025.

## Key Provisions

- Establishes a temporary commission to study AI, robotics, and automation regulation.
- Commission to analyze current laws and comparative state policies.
- Investigates liability issues related to AI and automation.
- Examines the impact of AI on employment and data privacy.
- Commission to issue a final report no later than 30 days prior to the expiration of the act.
- Members serve without compensation but are reimbursed for expenses.
- Commission may conduct hearings or take written testimony as necessary.

## Compliance Checklist

- Prepare for potential regulatory changes based on commission findings. | Who: Businesses operating in AI and automation. | Penalty: Potential regulatory penalties if non-compliance occurs after new regulations are enacted.
