## Summary

This bill prohibits state agencies from using AI systems for decisions affecting individual rights, requiring human personnel instead.

## Business Impact

If you operate a state agency in New York, you must ensure all decisions affecting individuals are made by human personnel by the effective date or face legal action.

## Key Provisions

- Prohibits state agencies from using AI for decision-making affecting individual rights.
- Requires decisions to be made by human personnel.
- Allows AI use in advisory roles and for non-decision-making purposes.
- Mandates development of compliance policies by state agencies.
- Empowers the attorney general to enforce compliance.

- Ensure all decisions affecting individuals are made by human personnel. | Who: State agencies and state-owned entities. | Penalty: Legal action by the attorney general for non-compliance.
- Develop and implement compliance policies. | Who: Each state agency and state-owned entity. | Penalty: Legal action by the attorney general for non-compliance.
