Summary

This bill mandates a protocol for regulating AI and facial recognition in criminal investigations and restricts AI-generated evidence in court.

Business Impact

If you use AI or facial recognition in criminal investigations in New York, you must comply with new protocols or face legal challenges.

Key Provisions

- Establishes a protocol for AI and FRT use in criminal investigations.
- Prohibits AI-generated outputs as evidence in court.
- Requires law enforcement training on AI and FRT limitations.
- Mandates independent audits of FRT systems for accuracy.
- Ensures transparency in AI usage by requiring detailed disclosures.
- Provides funding for expert witnesses for indigent defendants.
