Summary

This bill prohibits the use of facial recognition technology with police officer cameras in New York.

Business Impact

If you operate police body cameras in New York, you must stop using facial recognition technology immediately to avoid legal issues.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits facial recognition technology use with police officer cameras.
- Applies to both local and state police forces.
