The bill establishes a task force to study privacy concerns and regulatory approaches related to facial recognition technology in New York.

## Business Impact

If you develop or use facial recognition technology in New York, you must prepare for potential regulatory changes by the task force's report in one year.

## Key Provisions

- Establishes a task force to study facial recognition technology regulation.
- Defines facial recognition technology and its implications for privacy.
- Requires a report of findings to be submitted within one year.
- Task force members will not receive compensation but can claim expenses.
- Members appointed by various state officials, including the governor.
- Task force can request data and assistance from state agencies.
