This bill prohibits law enforcement from using biometric surveillance technology and establishes a task force to study its implications.

Business Impact

If you operate a law enforcement agency in New York, you must cease using biometric surveillance technology immediately or face legal action.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits law enforcement from using biometric surveillance technology.
- Establishes a task force to study biometric surveillance.
- Defines key terms related to biometric information and surveillance.
- Allows for limited exceptions for mobile fingerprint scanning and DNA comparisons under specific conditions.
