Summary

This bill allows fully autonomous vehicles to operate on public roads without a human driver, provided certain conditions are met.

Business Impact

If you operate fully autonomous vehicles in New York, you must ensure they are registered and insured by the effective date or face penalties.

Key Provisions

- Allows operation of fully autonomous vehicles without a human driver if the automated driving system is engaged.
- Requires vehicles to achieve a minimal risk condition in case of system failure.
- Mandates submission of a law enforcement interaction plan before operation.
- Establishes insurance requirements for fully autonomous vehicles.
- Specifies registration and title requirements for fully autonomous vehicles.
- Defines key terms related to autonomous vehicle operation.
