Prohibits the use of biometric surveillance technology by law enforcement; establishes the biometric surveillance regulation task force; and provides for the expiration and repeal of certain provisions

## Summary

Bill S 1033 prohibits law enforcement from using biometric surveillance technology, establishes a task force to study its regulation, and includes specific exceptions and expiration provisions.

## Business Impact

If you use biometric surveillance technology, you must cease its use by law enforcement or face legal challenges.

## Key Provisions

- Prohibits law enforcement from using biometric surveillance systems (Section 837-y), with exceptions such as mobile fingerprint scanning, DNA comparisons, and security systems for police agency access.
- Establishes a biometric surveillance regulation task force (Section 236).
- Allows for legal action against violations (Section 837-y, subsection 3).
- Provides for the expiration and repeal of certain provisions.
