Summary

This bill mandates a bureau within the Department of Commerce (DOC) to study automation's economic effects on Florida's workforce at specified intervals, with reports due by a specified date.

Business Impact

If you employ automation or AI in Florida, you must be aware of the study's findings by the report submission date to adjust your strategies accordingly.

Key Provisions

- Requires a bureau within the DOC to study the economic impact of automation and AI on employment at specified intervals.
- Bureau must consult with specified entities during the study.
- The study's focus on economic impact is specified in the bill description.
- Report to be submitted to the Governor and Legislature by a specified date.
