Summary

This bill revises provisions on instructional materials, dual enrollment programs, and standardized assessments in Florida.

Business Impact

If you employ automation or AI in Florida, you must be aware of the study's findings by the report submission date to adjust your strategies accordingly.

Key Provisions

- Requires a bureau within the DOC to study the economic impact of automation and AI on employment.
- Bureau must consult with specified entities during the study.
- The study's focus on economic impact is specified in the bill description.
- Report to be submitted to the Governor and Legislature.

Compliance Checklist

- Conduct a study on the economic impact of automation and AI. | Who: Bureau within the Department of Corrections. | Penalty: No direct penalties specified, but implications for future regulations.
- Consult with specified entities during the study. | Who: Bureau within the Department of Corrections. | Penalty: No direct penalties specified.
