Summary

This bill mandates a study on the economic impact of automation and AI on Florida's workforce, focusing on job losses and gains, affected industries, regions, demographics, wages, and policy recommendations.

Business Impact

If you operate in Florida and utilize AI or automation, you must prepare for potential workforce changes and policy updates by December 1, 2025.

Key Provisions

- Defines 'artificial intelligence' and its operational parameters.
- Mandates a study on the economic impact of automation and AI on employment, focusing on job losses and gains.
- Requires the bureau to analyze affected industries, geographic regions, demographics, and wages.
- Authorizes consultation with various stakeholders for the study.
- Requires a report to be submitted to the Governor and Legislature by December 1, 2025.
- Establishes a recurring study every three years to update findings and recommendations.
