Summary

This bill establishes strict liability for developers of certain AI models for injuries factually and proximately caused to non-users.

Business Impact

If you develop AI models in New York, you must ensure compliance with strict liability standards or face legal consequences.

Key Provisions

- Developers of covered AI models are strictly liable for injuries factually and proximately caused to non-users.
- Definitions of 'artificial intelligence', 'covered model', and 'developer' are provided.
- Conduct causing injury must be similar to negligent or intentional acts by humans.

Compliance Checklist

- Ensure AI models comply with strict liability standards | Who: Developers of covered AI models | Penalty: Legal consequences for non-compliance
- Document and assess the training process and capabilities of AI models | Who: Developers of covered AI models | Penalty: Potential liability for injuries caused
