Relating to the use of artificial intelligence to score certain portions of assessment instruments administered to public school students.

Summary

This bill prohibits the use of AI to score constructed responses on student assessments, with specific exceptions.

Business Impact

If you use AI to score student assessments in Texas, you must comply with new scoring standards by the 2025-2026 school year or face penalties.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits AI from scoring constructed responses on assessments, with exceptions.
- Allows AI scoring if trained on representative samples of disadvantaged students.
- Requires scoring methods to demonstrate validity and reliability.
- Mandates evaluation by an independent entity for AI scoring methods.
- Applies starting with the 2025-2026 school year.
- Takes effect immediately with a two-thirds vote or on September 1, 2025.
