Summary

This bill regulates AI systems to prevent discrimination, mandates independent audits for high-risk systems, allows enforcement by the attorney general, and provides a private right of action. The bill specifies measures to prevent algorithmic discrimination and outlines penalties for non-compliance.

Business Impact

If you develop or use high-risk AI systems in New York, you must undergo independent audits to ensure compliance or face legal action.

Key Provisions

- Regulates the development and use of certain AI systems to prevent algorithmic discrimination.
- Requires independent audits for high-risk AI systems, with the definition confirmed in the bill text.
- Empowers the attorney general to enforce compliance with specific penalties for non-compliance.
- Provides a private right of action for individuals affected by discriminatory AI.
