

SB 1580 • Tennessee

As introduced, deletes the requirement that a high school student must be a Tennessee resident for at least one year in order to be eligible to receive a dual enrollment grant. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 4.

Summary

This bill removes the one-year residency requirement for Tennessee high school students to receive a dual enrollment grant.

Business Impact

If you develop AI systems for mental health services in Tennessee, you must ensure they do not claim to be qualified professionals or face penalties.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits AI systems from claiming to be qualified mental health professionals.
- Applies to all persons developing or deploying such systems.
- Amends TCA Title 33, Title 47, and Title 63.

Compliance Checklist

- Ensure AI systems do not claim to be qualified mental health professionals. | Who: Developers and companies in mental health technology. | Penalty: Potential penalties for misleading claims.
