AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 4; Title 10; Title 16; Title 36; Title 37; Title 38; Title 39; Title 40; Title 45; Title 47; Title 48; Title 49; Title 53; Title 63; Title 67; Title 68 and Title 71, relative to artificial intelligence.

## Summary

The bill mandates annual reports on AI's impacts to be published on the General Assembly's website, in addition to existing submission requirements.

## Business Impact

If you are involved in AI-related activities in Tennessee, you must ensure your findings are reported annually or face potential scrutiny.

## Key Provisions

- Requires annual publication of AI impact findings on the General Assembly's website.
- Maintains existing reporting requirements to the governor and legislative speakers.
- Focuses on economic, labor, and ethical impacts of artificial intelligence.

## Compliance Checklist

- Publish annual findings on AI impacts | Who: Joint chairs of the artificial intelligence advisory council | Penalty: Potential scrutiny for non-compliance
