

## Artificial Intelligence Bill of Rights

## Summary

The bill prohibits governmental entities from extending or renewing contracts with specified entities starting July 1, 2024, and requires parental consent for minors on chatbot platforms.

## Business Impact

If you operate chatbot platforms, you must obtain parental consent for minors or face compliance issues.

## Key Provisions

- Mandates parental consent for minors to become account holders on chatbot platforms.
- Prohibits governmental entities from entering into, extending, or renewing contracts with specified entities starting July 1, 2024, unless specific requirements are met.
- Restricts local governmental entities from contracting with an entity to provide AI technology, software, or products unless certain requirements are met.
- Requires bot operators to periodically provide a certain notification to users.

## Compliance Checklist

- Ensure compliance with new contracting requirements for AI technology. | Who: Businesses providing AI technology to governmental entities. | Penalty: Risk of losing contracts with governmental entities.
- Implement parental consent mechanisms for chatbot platforms. | Who: Operators of chatbot platforms. | Penalty: Potential legal repercussions and inability to operate in the market.
