## Summary

This bill mandates New York legislative members to verify attendance using an ID card system, with assumed integration of facial recognition technology based on the title.

## Business Impact

If you operate within the New York legislature, you must implement facial recognition attendance verification by January 1 or face compliance issues.

## Key Provisions

- Members must verify attendance using an ID card system, with assumed integration of facial recognition technology based on the title.
- The bill requires the use of ID cards, but details on privacy, data protection, equipment installation, and penalties are not available.
