

# SB 110 • Louisiana

Prohibits using a child's image to train artificial intelligence to produce child sexual abuse materials. (8/1/26)

Passed Both Chambers

Risk: High

Narrow/Targeted

Effective: Aug 01, 2026 | Last Action (May 14, 2026): Effective date 8/1/2026.

## Summary

This bill prohibits using a child's image to train AI for producing child sexual abuse materials, effective August 1, 2026. Specifics are unknown without the full bill text.

## Business Impact

If you use AI that involves children's images in Louisiana, you must ensure compliance with this prohibition by August 1, 2026, or face legal consequences.

## Key Provisions

- Prohibits using a child's image to train AI systems.
- Specifically targets the production of child sexual abuse materials.
- Effective date set for August 1, 2026.
- Specifics on penalties, exceptions, or definitions are unknown without the full bill text.
