Summary

This bill prohibits the disclosure of public school teachers' residential addresses under the Freedom of Information Act and creates a task force to address AI-related mass requests.

Business Impact

If you operate a public school in Connecticut, you must ensure residential addresses of employees are not disclosed under FOIA or face potential legal challenges.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits disclosure of residential addresses of public school teachers under FOIA.
- Establishes a task force to study mass requests created by AI.
- Aims to enhance privacy protections for public school teachers.
