

Artificial Intelligence Bill of Rights

Summary

The bill focuses on AI technology regulations, including requiring parental consent for minors using chatbots and periodic notifications from bot operators.

Business Impact

If you operate an AI technology company in Florida, you must comply with new user rights and contract requirements by July 1, 2026, or face penalties.

Key Provisions

- Requires parental consent for minors to use companion chatbot platforms.
- Sets conditions for local governmental entities to contract with AI technology providers.
- Requires bot operators to provide clear and periodic notifications to users when interacting with bots.
- The prohibitions and requirements begin on January 1, 2024.

Compliance Checklist

- Ensure compliance with new user rights regarding AI interactions. | Who: AI technology companies operating in Florida. | Penalty: Civil penalties for non-compliance.
- Obtain parental consent for minors using chatbot platforms. | Who: Operators of companion chatbot platforms. | Penalty: Potential civil penalties and enforcement actions.

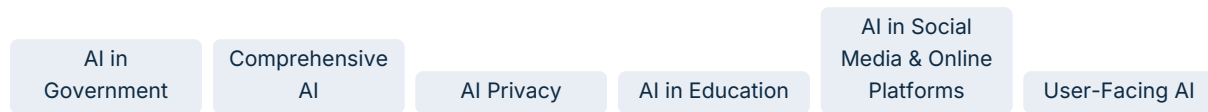
