BIOMETRIC DATA-COMMERCIAL USE

Last Action (Jan 08, 2019): Session Sine Die

Summary

This bill restricts private entities from requiring biometric data for goods or services, with exceptions for certain sectors, and mandates written consent and disclosure.

Business Impact

If you collect biometric data in Illinois, you must ensure compliance with consent requirements or face potential legal penalties.

Key Provisions

- Private entities cannot require biometric data for goods/services, except for background checks or security protocols.
- Exemptions apply to medical service providers, law enforcement, and governmental entities.
- Entities must develop a public policy on the retention and destruction of biometric data.
- Private entities must inform individuals in writing and obtain written consent before collecting biometric data.

Compliance Checklist

- Ensure biometric data is not required for goods/services unless exempted. | Who: Private entities collecting biometric data. | Penalty: Potential legal action for non-compliance.
- Develop and publicly share a policy on biometric data retention and destruction. | Who: Private entities in possession of biometric data. | Penalty: Potential legal action for non-compliance.
