SAFE AUTONOMOUS VEHICLE ACT

Enacted

Last Action (Jan 08, 2019): Session Sine Die

Summary

The Safe Autonomous Vehicle Act allows manufacturers to operate autonomous vehicles under specific conditions and assumes liability for incidents.

Business Impact

If you manufacture or operate autonomous vehicles in Illinois, you must self-certify compliance and notify the DMV to avoid penalties.

Key Provisions

- Manufacturers must notify the DMV and self-certify to commence a SAVE project.
- Manufacturers assume liability for incidents caused by their ADS technology.
- Individuals operating ADS vehicles without meeting eligibility face fines up to \$10,000.
- The bill preempts home rule powers regarding the regulation of SAVE projects.
- Manufacturers must maintain incident records and provide summaries to the DMV and NHTSA.
- Vehicles in the Participating Fleet must be insured by the manufacturer.

Compliance Checklist

- Notify the DMV and self-certify compliance to commence a SAVE project | Who: Motor Vehicle Manufacturers
- Maintain incident records and provide summaries to the DMV and NHTSA | Who: Motor Vehicle Manufacturers
- Ensure all ADS vehicles are insured and comply with state laws | Who: Motor Vehicle Manufacturers
- Do not operate ADS vehicles without meeting eligibility requirements | Who: Individuals operating ADS vehicles | Penalty: \$10,000 fine for first violation; Class A misdemeanor for subsequent violations
