Last Action (Dec 02, 2025): Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.

HB6356 aims to protect individual rights concerning computational algorithms at the federal level. Specific provisions and potential impact cannot be assessed without the full text.
