## Summary

Bill S301 proposes the Massachusetts Information Privacy and Security Act, focusing on data protection, transparency, and economic development through data privacy.

## Business Impact

If you operate in Massachusetts, you must comply with enhanced data privacy regulations by January 1, 2025, or face significant penalties.

## Key Provisions

- Data minimization
- Encryption standards
- Breach notification requirements
- Consumer rights to access and delete personal data

- Ensure user consent for data sharing | Who: Businesses collecting personal data | Penalty: To be determined
