Summary

This bill establishes regulations on the dissemination of deep fakes, including definitions, limitations, and penalties for violations.

Business Impact

If you create or share digital content in Kentucky, you must ensure it does not include deep fakes or face criminal penalties.

Key Provisions

- Defines terms related to deep fakes.
- Establishes limitations on the dissemination of deep fakes.
- Specifies exceptions to the limitations.
- Sets a statute of limitations for legal actions regarding deep fakes.
- Imposes criminal penalties for illegal dissemination of deep fakes.

Compliance Checklist

- Ensure all digital content does not include deep fakes unless compliant with exceptions. | Who: Content creators and distributors. | Penalty: Criminal penalties for violations.
- Review and update content policies to align with new definitions and limitations. | Who: Businesses operating in digital media. | Penalty: Potential legal action for non-compliance.
