Maryland Cybersecurity Council - Alterations

Passed Both Chambers

Amendment

Effective: Oct 01, 2025 | Last Action (May 20, 2025): Approved by the Governor - Chapter 627

Summary

The bill alters the Maryland Cybersecurity Council's membership selection and mandates assessments of cybersecurity threats.

Business Impact

If you operate in cybersecurity in Maryland, you must prepare for AI threat assessments by October 1, 2025, or risk non-compliance penalties.

Key Provisions

- Alters the selection process for the Maryland Cybersecurity Council's chair and vice chair.
- Mandates biennial elections for leadership positions starting October 1, 2025.
- Requires the Council to assess cybersecurity threats from AI and quantum computing.

- Prepare for biennial leadership elections within the Council | Who: Members of the Maryland Cybersecurity Council | Penalty: Non-compliance penalties not specified
- Conduct assessments of AI-related cybersecurity threats | Who: Maryland Cybersecurity Council | Penalty: Non-compliance penalties not specified
