Summary

HB1391 requires the Maryland State Department of Education to develop AI guidance and promote AI training, involving CTE committees.

Business Impact

If you operate in education, you must align with AI guidelines or face undefined consequences.

Key Provisions

- State Department of Education must develop and update AI guidance.
- Promotion of AI training and workforce development is required.
- CTE Committees must use the Department's guidance and consult with the Department if necessary.
