Summary

This bill establishes a Task Force to study law enforcement's use of surveillance technologies in Maryland and report findings by December 5, 2017.

Business Impact

If you operate a business that uses surveillance technology in Maryland, you must be prepared for potential regulations stemming from the Task Force's findings.

Key Provisions

- Establishes a Task Force to study law enforcement surveillance technologies.
- Requires review of current and planned uses of surveillance technology.
- Task Force to submit findings and recommendations by December 5, 2017.
- State agencies must provide staffing for the Task Force.

Compliance Checklist

- Prepare for potential regulatory changes based on Task Force findings. | Who: Businesses using surveillance technologies. | Penalty: Potential regulatory consequences if new laws are enacted.
